REFLECTIONS From the Interim Associate Pastor

*They devoted themselves to the apostle's teaching and fellowship,
to the breaking of bread and the prayers.*

Acts 2:42

Dear Friends at First Lutheran Church,

This verse of scripture (above) is part of what will be read during worship at the ELCA Churchwide Assembly on Saturday, August 22nd. Our sisters and brothers who have been elected to serve as members of this assembly will convene from the 17th to the 23rd, gathering for worship each day. Those present will have the unique opportunity to devote themselves in a specific way which resonates with the practices of "The First Converts" as Luke records in the Book of Acts.

Presiding Bishop Mark S. Hanson has asked that all of us join in prayer during these days leading up to the Churchwide Assembly. If you click on the ELCA website (www.elca.org) you can find more information about the assembly, its agenda and topics, as well as the Scripture that will be read and contemplated each day. Bishop Hanson writes "We are an evangelizing church, and this mission flows out of a life attentive to God's Word and rooted in unceasing prayer for the Spirit's life-giving work with the Word." He has requested that we pray "for the whole Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, for those who will gather in Minneapolis, for decisions to be made, and for faithfulness in discerning those directions to which God is calling this evangelizing church in mission and service for the sake of the world."

I encourage all of you to join in adding these daily prayers during this month, and to watch for news of the work of the Churchwide Assembly. (By the way, be sure to check the ELCA News Release posted on July 15th concerning the "ELCA Pastor Returns to Work after Liver Transplant" – I think you know him!) I also want to encourage you to prayerfully consider how you will join others at First Lutheran this fall in being "devoted to the apostle's teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." Currently I'm working on the project of planning education opportunities for adults to delve into this fall, and I would love to hear from you as we finish these plans about your longings, your questions, and how you would like to participate.

My tenure at FLC depends on the work of the Holy Spirit through the service of your Call Committee. My commitment to serve under the auspices of the Nebraska Synod is to see FLC through a healthy transition, and I'm happy to be here joining with all of you to do so. In order to keep this Interim work sustainable, I will now start serving parttime – and this means that occasionally I'll be spending a whole week at a time in Iowa City with my family. Know that whether I'm here or whether I'm away, I'll join you in prayer for the ways in which God is leading FLC to become joyous and faithful disciples!

HEALTH

Of Special Concerns

We all sleep - up to 1/3 of our lives is spent sleeping! And we all need sleep. We can't survive without it! While everyone recognizes how a poor night's sleep may make them feel, only recently have scientists begun to fully understand the profound impact that sleep and sleep disorders have on our health and well-being. The consequences of sleep-related problems range from simply not feeling well, to increased motor vehicle accidents, to serious effects on blood pressure control as well as increased risk for heart disease and stroke. It can affect grades and the frequency of illness.

Unfortunately, many individuals are not aware that they may suffer from one of the more than 90 recognized sleep disorders. Almost all of the conditions, once diagnosed, can be treated successfully.

Insufficient sleep (lack of adequate sleep)

- ✦ Snoring
- ✦ Sleep apnea
- ✦ Narcolepsy
- ✦ Restless legs syndrome
- ✦ Insomnia
- ✦ Circadian rhythm disorders, including shift work disorder and jet lag

Whether or not you have a primary sleep disorder, it's always a good idea to practice the rules of good sleep hygiene, also known as good sleep habits. This is especially important for our youth and families as we begin a new school term.

Work on the various kits for **Lutheran World Relief & Lutheran Family Services** has started. We can only assemble them with help from everyone at First Lutheran. A table is located at the west end of Fellowship Hall and has details for each kit. Please check it out weekly for patterns, fabric, etc. That is also where the collected and purchased items can be put.

Now is the time to purchase items for the **SCHOOL KITS**. Sales for Back to School have started. Items needed: notebooks of ruled paper 8 1/2 x 11 inches with 100-150 sheets, blunt scissors, rulers, pencil sharpeners, pencils with erasers, construction paper, boxes of crayons. These items are then put into a 12" x 14" cloth bag. (See LCW display for patterns and sample) These kits will be distributed to children whose lives have been disrupted by war or other disaster. Receiving a school kit is a sign that someone far away cares.

In refugee camps, mission hospitals and villages around the world, gifts of **LAYETTES** convey a warm welcome to infants and their mothers. Items needed: Onesies, shirts, gowns, receiving blankets, cloth diapers, sweater, washcloths, bath size soap, diaper or very large safety pins. Garage sales are a great place to get most of these items as they can be "gently used". Sizes up to 24 months are needed. Diapers can be made from 100% cotton L or XL white or light colored T-shirts.

Clean hands, good grooming, bright and shining smiles are brought to children through the gift of a **HEALTH KITS**. This kit consists of a hand towel, washcloth, bath size soap, toothpaste, pick type comb (one of plastic with big teeth), metal nail file or clipper, and Band-Aids. If you have worn towels that are still in good condition, bring them. They can be cut down and serged to make hand towels and washcloths.
